Neighborhood Watch Program

Neighborhood watch is one of the most effective ways to prevent crime, attend to home and personal security, address the safety of our children and the elderly and reduce fear and isolation. Civic involvement, collaborative problem solving and mutual commitment have helped cities and neighborhoods reduce crime by significant numbers. Today, neighborhood watch is the nation's largest single organized crime prevention project.

BENEFITS OF NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH:

- Deters criminal activity;
- Creates a greater sense of security and reduces fear of crime;
- Builds bonds with neighbors; people look out for one another; stimulates neighborhood awareness;
- Reduces the risk of becoming a crime victim; reduces the physical, financial and psychological costs of crime;
- Instructs residents on how to observe and report suspicious activities in your community; and
- Addresses quality of life issues and mutual interests in your community.

The Charles County Sheriff's Office recently issued two separate, and unrelated, warnings about the rise of residential burglaries in the Waldorf area. Already in July, eight known incidents have occurred in the Billingsley Road and Bensville Road area, with crimes occurring between 10am and 3pm on weekdays. Four of these crimes occurred on July 16th alone! They also issued a warning to residents of Hampshire, Dorchester, and *Lancaster* neighborhoods. **Eighteen** incidents have been reported since the end of May. Weekdays between 9am and 3pm are the favorite times for these criminals.
